World Peace Flame

Thank you Concord, Lord Mayor, and each and every one of you for gathering together in peace and in respect of each other and our individual beliefs.

We are delighted to be here again with The World Peace Flame, and honour its simple message, one flame uniting people worldwide, to unite us all in peace this evening.

We have England's first and now second World Peace Flames here in Leeds, in Garforth and Scholes. In Garforth our community, particularly our schools, are embracing its message with ongoing projects and peace assemblies.

Our current project, in which children draw around their hands with a statement of what peace means to them and what they can do for peace, inspired by the WPFF, has been further uplifted by the amazing inspiration of the Head Teacher of Strawberry Fields School, for her pupils to take the project to other schools with us, offering out the hand of peace and friendship. So we have five young primary students who are members of the school Eco Council standing in front of up to 400 children a time, speaking of kindness, care of our environment and peace. They are truly amazing.

The aim Is to create a PeaceArt Exhibition in Garforth created by our primary school children. Also our Garforth Schools will be part of the second Garforth Annual Peace Lantern Walk on Thursday 7th November from Strawberry Fields School to the Garforth Peace Flame for Armistice Day with peaceful reflection. Last year nearly 300 children and families joined the walk.

These simple acts help us to remember that we really can make a difference and that we can become the peace we wish to see in the world.

I believe gatherings such as this, where we can all honour and respect each other and each other's beliefs in peace add to the peace In the world, so thank you all.

I Invite you all to take several WPF candles, and pass these on. Each candle has been lit from this precious flame of peace and every candle it lights becomes another WPF.

I also invite you to carry it with you— It does not need to be lit; it carries the energy regardless—and use it as a point of peaceful focus in any and every situation.

Christian - Revd Bob Shaw

If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.
